82% of breaches involved human error, accidental misuse, or social engineering.⁵

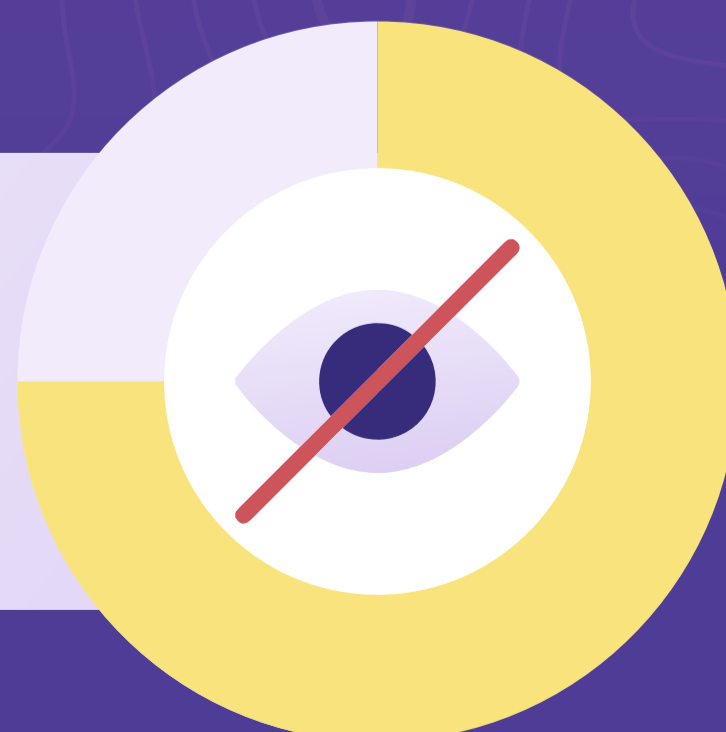
4. Creating a Mobile Print Strategy
